



Neighborhoods Stonington

The town of **Stonington** is located in New London County, United States, in the state's southeastern corner. It includes the Stoington Borough, the villages of Pawcatuck, Lords Point, and Wequetequock, and the eastern halves of the villages of Mystic and Old Mystic (the other halves being in the town of Groton).

Stonington repulsed two British naval bombardments. One, during the American Revolution, was a desultory bombardment by Sir James Wallace in the frigate HMS Rose on August 30, 1775.

The other was a more damaging three-day affair between August 9 and 12, 1814. The British vessels, HMS Ramilles, HMS Pactolus, HMS Dispatch, and HMS Terror, under the command of Sir Thomas Hardy, appeared offshore on August 9, 1814. The British demanded immediate surrender, but Stonington's citizens replied with a note that stated, "We shall defend the place to the last extremity; should it be destroyed, we shall perish in its ruins." For three days the Royal Navy pounded the town, but the only fatality was that of an elderly woman who was mortally ill. The British, after suffering many dead and wounded, sailed off on 12 August.



New London is a seaport city and a port of entry on the northeast coast of the United States. It is located at the mouth of the Thames River in New London County in southeastern CT. New London is located about 47 miles (76 km) from the state capital of Hartford, 107 miles (172 km) from Boston, MA, 56 miles (90 km) from Providence, RI, and about 128 miles (206 km) from New York City.

For several decades beginning in the early 19th century, New London was the world's third busiest whaling port after New Bedford and Nantucket, MA. The wealth that whaling brought into the city furnished the capital to fund much of the city's present architecture.

New London subsequently became home to other shipping and manufacturing industries, but has gradually lost its commercial and industrial heart. The city is home to Connecticut College, Mitchell College, the United States Coast Guard Academy, and The Williams School.

The Coast Guard Station New London and New London Harbor is home port to the US Coast Guard Cutter *Chinook* and the ad the Coast Guard's Tall Ship, Eagle.



<u>East Lyme</u> is located in southern New London County, west of <u>Waterford</u> and <u>Montville</u>, east of <u>Lyme</u> and <u>Old Lyme</u>, and south of <u>Salem</u>. <u>Long Island Sound</u> is to the south.

The town consists primarily of two villages, Flanders and Niantic. It is common for the town of East Lyme to be erroneously called "Niantic", due to this side of town being the "beach" side which is popular with tourists and visitors in the summer months. Niantic's population doubles in the summer months for the beach season, and it has a much higher density than the more sparsely populated Flanders side of town, which is known for its apple orchards, the town's high school, and forest.



Population growth in the past thirty years has continued, but at nowhere near the break-neck pace of the 1950s and 1960s; today, the main challenge to preserving North Stonington's historically rural character comes less from housing subdivisions and more from big commercial development ideas.

The town, because of its access to I-95, rural charm, and after 1992 its proximity to the <u>Mashantucket casino</u> in the adjacent town of <u>Ledyard</u>, has attracted numerous would-be developers who have advanced as-yet unsuccessful entertainment park schemes for the town.

North Stonington residents and visitors cherish the town for its beauty and historic value. In 1983 the village was added to the <u>National Register of Historic Places</u>, based on 58 existing homes and other buildings from the late 18th and early 19th centuries within its environs. Two houses located elsewhere in the town, for their age and historic value, are also on the register: the homes of Luther Palmer and John Randall.

Charlestown is named after King Charles II and was incorporated in 1738. The area was formerly part of the town of Westerly. It was in turn divided and the part north of the Pawcatuck River became the town of Richmond in 1747.

Burlingame State Park and Campground is entirely contained inside the town of Charlestown. The campground is 3,100 acres of rocky woodland that surrounds Watchaug Pond in Charlestown. Activities at the park include 755 campsites, fishing, swimming, picnicking, boating and hiking. The area north of Buckeye Brook Road, abutting the Pawcatuck River, is primarily a hunting area.

Central to all beaches in Southern Rhode Island, Charlestown's secluded coastline is the ideal location for swimming, sailing, beach-combing, surfing and boating.




